Confirmation letter will be sent upon booking.

### **Guided Tour \$50/per guided tour up to 60 min**

Tour for up to 25 students. Over 25 students may require additional tour guide. *(Remarkable Red Deer or Temporary exhibit)*

### **In-Person School Program**

**\$150** (2 hours, up to 25 students)

Includes: PowerPoint presentation with artifacts, museum activity or tour and 1 hour art activity that students will take home.

\*Additional students \$6.00 each.

\*\*Parent helpers and all teaching staff are free.

### **Virtual School Program\* - \$100**

(multiple classes) (1-1.5 hours)

\*You will receive a zoom link prior to the program and pre-program information and handouts.

### **Self-guided online\*\* - \$20** (1 week access)

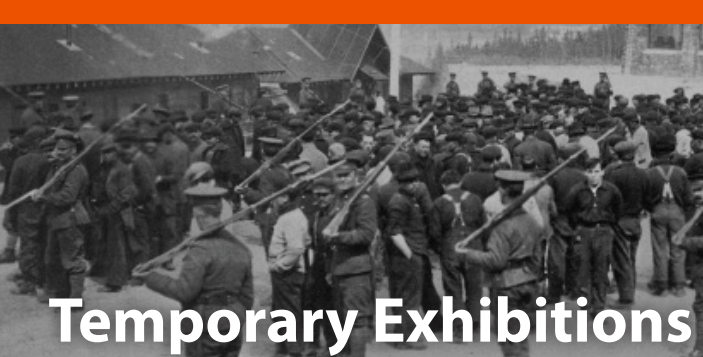

## Temporary Exhibitions

(Oct. 14, 2023- Jan. 7, 2024)

### **Lost Liberties : The War Measures Act**

Exploring the suspension of civil liberties in Canada during the First World War, the Second World War and the 1970 October Crisis, **Lost Liberties- The War Measures Act** sheds new light on the enduring impact of the Act on Canada and its people.

We will explore wartime propaganda posters, discuss wartime rationing and look at artifacts as part of the interactive activities during the tour.

**Tour + Art Activity: (Grades 4+)**

**Embossed Foil Tin Cans:** Create your own embossed emblem using embossed foil. Wrap it around a recycled tin can, in the style of trench art, made from recycled wartime waste.

(May - August 2024)

### **George Littlechild - Here I am, Can you see me?**

This exhibit by George Littlechild involves a series of 22 drawings of First Nations children who perished while attending residential school in Maskwacis, AB. George Littlechild is committed to righting the wrongs in his artworks. \*Trigger warning.
